Skilled Independent visa (Subclass 189)- Permanent Residence

This visa is for invited workers and New Zealand citizens with skills required to live and work permanently anywhere in Australia. There are two streams in it

- Points tested stream
- New Zealand stream

Points tested stream

This visa lets invited workers with skills we need live and work permanently anywhere in Australia.

- You don't need a sponsor or nominator
- You must be invited to apply
- You must be under 45 to be invited.

New Zealand stream

This visa lets eligible New Zealand citizens who have demonstrated commitment and contribution to Australia live and work in Australia permanently.

- You must hold a New Zealand Special Category (subclass 444) visa
- You must have lived in Australia for at least the last 5 years

You must have started living here on or before 19 February 2016.







Processing Time

9-12 Months



Eligibility

- Your occupation must be on the relevant list of eligible skilled occupations.
- You must perform a successful skill assessment through the authorized assessing authority to show that you have the skills and qualifications to work in your chosen occupation.
- You must lodge an Expression of Interest (EOI) and be invited to apply for this visa
- You must score a minimum of 65 points to be invited to apply, however, invitations are often issued to applicants with more than 65 points.
- You must meet the points score eligibility at the time you are invited to apply for the visa.
- You can provide evidence of at least competent English, however, additional points will be awarded for proficient and superior English scores
- You are under 45 when you receive an invitation to apply.
- You must meet the health & character requirements
- If you are a New Zealand Citizen, you may be eligible to apply for the New Zealand Stream 189 Visa instead.



- A successful applicant and any dependents may:
- Live and work in Australia as permanent residents,
- Access the Medicare health care scheme,
- Pursue basic and advanced education,
- In time, apply for citizenship, and
- Sponsor their own relatives for permanent residence.

Skilled Independent Visa (Subclass 190)- Permanent Residence

This visa lets invited workers with skills required to live and work permanently anywhere in Australia. This visa requires the applicant to complete a skills test and be nominated by a state or territory government.

The Skilled Nominated Work Visa (subclass 190) requires you to be nominated by a state or territory government. Once you submit you're EOI, it will be viewable by government authorities looking for prospective workers with your skill set. If a government decides to nominate you, you will receive a letter of invitation to apply for the 190 visa.

Processing Time

9-12 Months

Eligibility

- Your occupation must be on the relevant list of eligible skilled occupations.
- You must perform a successful skill assessment through the authorized assessing authority to show that you have the skills and qualifications to work in your chosen occupation.

Global Talent visa (Subclass 858)

Global Talent visa, offers a streamlined visa pathway for highly skilled professionals, or for those who have achieved prominence in the arts, sport or research and academia. It has been designed to attract the best and brightest global talent who are interested in working and living permanently in Australia (migrating to Australia).

Processing Time

2-3 Months

Eligibility

- Are distinguished in one of the identified Global Talent Visa industries:
 Resources, Agri-Food and AgTech, Energy, Health Industries, Defence, Advanced
 Manufacturing and Space, Circular economy, DigiTech, Infrastructure and
 tourism, financial services and FinTech, and Education.
- Have an Australian nominator; you will need an Australian citizen or an Australian organization to nominate you for the Global Talent visa. There is no fee payable with the nomination, and there are no ongoing obligations for your nominator.
 - The nominator should be in a position of expertise in Australia in your field so as to be able to verify that you have the national/international reputation and that you should be granted a Global Talent visa. An organization, such as the Australian Computer Society, could also be a nominator.
- Are able to earn above the Fair Work High Income Threshold (FWHIT) (currently AU\$153,600 per annum) in Australia which can be demonstrated with evidence of current earnings, future job offers or recent PhD graduates in the target sectors.



- If applying from offshore or onshore and not yet earning this amount, you will need to demonstrate you have potential to earn \$153,900. In essence, an applicant needs to demonstrate that they would have no difficulty in obtaining employment (or establishing themselves independently) in their field at an income rate to meet Fair Work High Income Threshold (FWHIT).
- The application needs to address how they can be a potential asset to the Australian community;
- PhD graduates and certain PhD students may still be eligible to apply for the GTI
 Program if they can demonstrate exceptional talent and international recognition in
 a target sector. In addition, PhD students who are nearing completion of their
 degree must be able to demonstrate they had a record of achievement prior to
 commencing their PhD studies.
- The Department is also looking to target certain student cohorts with research that is internationally recognized and relevant to those targeted industries, including those who have recently (in the last 3 years) completed a PhD or (or are close to submitting their thesis).

- Stay in Australia indefinitely;
- Work and study in Australia;
- Apply for Medicare, Australia's scheme for health-related care and expenses;
- Sponsor eligible relatives for permanent residence;
- Travel to and from Australia on an ongoing basis, and be able to apply for a Resident Return visa;
- Apply for Australian citizenship, when eligible;
- Access certain Australian Government benefits (within prescribed waiting times)
- Buy property and join millions of Australians in the Australian dream of owning your own home;
- Enjoy free schooling for your children.

Skilled Recognized Graduate Visa (Visa Subclass 476)

This visa allows recent engineering graduates to live, work or study in Australia for up to 18 months. You must have completed a degree or higher qualification from a specified institution within the past 2 years, and be under 31 years of age.

With this visa

You can work or study anywhere in Australia.



Processing Time

12 to 14 Months

Eligibility

- Be under 31 years of age.
- Have completed an engineering degree at a specified educational institution in the past 2 years.
- Not have previously been the primary visa holders of a subclass 476 or 485 visa.
- Should meet the health and character requirements.
- Should have proper English Proficiency if you do not hold a passport.
- Must sign the Australian statement before applying for 476 skilled graduate visas.

Have engineering qualifications from a specified educational institution

When you apply, you must have completed an engineering course for which you were awarded a degree or higher qualification in the last 2 years.

This could be a:

- Bachelor's degree
- Masters degree
- Doctoral degree
- Postgraduate diploma

This qualification must be in an engineering discipline, such as:

- civil engineering
- structural engineering
- chemical engineering
- environmental engineering
- electrical and electronics engineering
- · mechanical, production and plant engineering
- mining and material engineering

You must have completed your engineering qualification at a specified educational institution. Any institution offering an Engineering qualification accredited under the Washington Accord is a specified institution.
